

SEPTIC TANKS

Are you septic tank smart? What is the condition of your septic tank?

Leaking tanks leach into groundwater and ultimately into our lakes. This issue is a contributing factor to the quality of water in our lake system. There are a number of ways to monitor the security of your tank.

- How often do you pump out based on usage?
- Adding of a dye to identify and potential leaks in your tank?
- Worse case scenario – ground is continually damp around the septic tank area or down hill from it?

As a responsible resident of the valley, do you ensure all waste water is collected into the septic tank and disposed of properly?

Outhouses are outdated, however, some do still exist. Are they in good condition, with a sealed vault? Open pits are not allowed by Public Health/Environmental standards.

- SaskWater manages and controls the Lagoon that services the RM of North Qu'Appelle. No. 187, the Village of Fort San, The Resort Village of B-Say-Tah and other contracted parties.
- SaskWater has licensing agreements with all of Septic Haulers.
- SaskWater has recently (May 2018) developed a "Hauler Log Sheet" (attached) that must be completed and submitted by all haulers on a timely basis or be subject to consequences.
- The "Hauler Log Sheet" information will be reviewed and used by each community to help determine which property owners are using the haulers' services.
